

Medieval Studies and Auxiliary Sciences

Students who subscribe for one or several courses listed in the cluster 'Medieval Studies and Auxiliary Sciences' are intrigued by the way medieval society was organized at the political, economic, cultural and religious levels; by medieval human behaviour and (competing) strands of ideas; and by how these phenomena came to expression in a very rich typology of primary sources produced roughly between 400 AD and 1500 AD.

The available courses offer insight into the current debates on each of the topics, and will enable students to critically analyze and reflect upon the methodological approaches to the medieval source material, whether narrative, literary or documentary. Teaching methods range from theoretical lectures to microteaching, tutorials, discussion classes and field trips. In doing so, students will be encouraged to communicate, cooperate and act in an inspiring, advisory and constructive manner with their fellow students.
