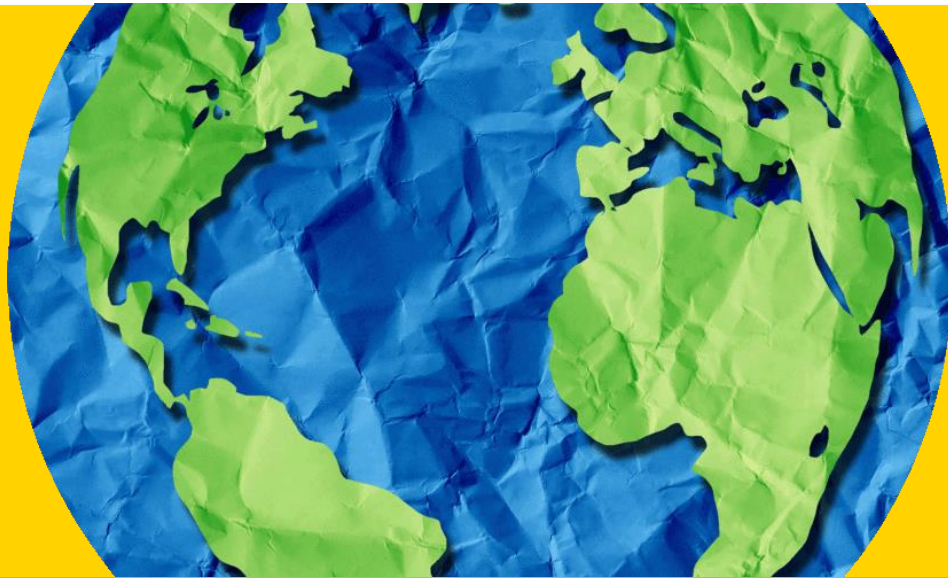

# Erasmus Mundus Master Global Studies

- Two-year internationally organised Master programme
- Founded in 2005 by four European universities:
  - Leipzig (coordinator), LSE, Vienna, Wroclaw
  - Roskilde joined in 2010
  - Ghent joined in 2017
  - LSE is not part of the consortium anymore. Instead, a [Double Master in Global Studies and Economic History](#) was launched in 2023.
- Nine non-European partner universities
- Courses are offered in English
- International composition of the student body
- Funded by the EU's excellence programme "Erasmus Mundus"

# Erasmus Mundus Programme

## Objectives of the Erasmus Mundus programme:

- to promote a quality offer in higher education with a distinct European added value
- to encourage and enable highly qualified graduates and scholars from all over the world to obtain qualifications and/or experience in the EU
- to improve accessibility and enhance the profile and visibility of higher education in the EU

# Global Studies as a research field

- **Transnational:** focused on the analysis of ideas, processes, events, etc that appear across national boundaries and cultural regions.
- **Interdisciplinary:** global phenomena are of various nature and can not be explained from the perspective of one discipline only
- **Both contemporary and historical:** the contemporary patterns of globalisation can be fully understood only by analysing their historical precedents.
- **Postcolonial and critical:** critical examination of eurocentric approaches and academic imperialism; comparative perspective and the notion of multiple globalisations

# Master of Arts in Global Studies

- **Research-based Master:** combining perspectives, methods and theories developed in multi- discipline to investigate phenomena of global interconnectedness.
- Understand the phenomena described as **globalisation** as a combination of various projects to manage increasing transnational and transcontinental connectedness.
- The **multinational classroom** of the programme and the **cross-over** of contributions from **various disciplines** and **universities** offer a substantial added value to the study of processes of globalisation.

# Study programme

## 12 modules of 10 ECTS – common features:

- Semester 1: introduction to Global Studies
- Semester 2: studying concrete themes from different disciplines and world-regional angles
- Semester 3: optional 3<sup>rd</sup> semester abroad/ studying concrete themes from different disciplines and world-regional angles
- Semester 4: Master thesis and courses helping students to frame their individual work within the larger research agenda of Global Studies

All modules comprise history, cultural, area studies, social or political science approaches to historical and contemporary processes of globalisation

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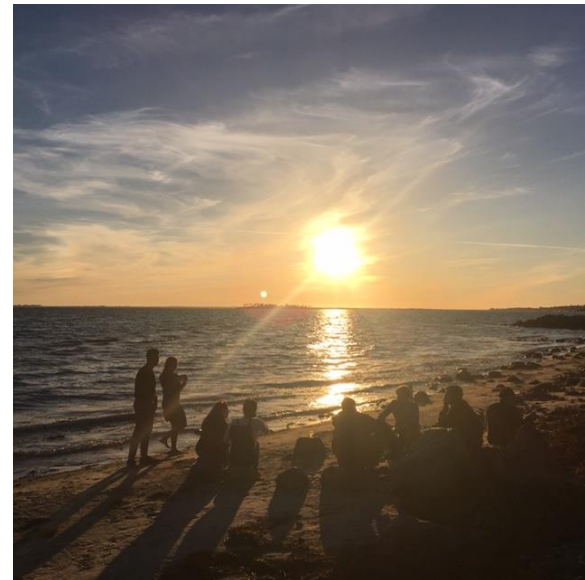

# Admission criteria

Applicants should fulfill the following minimal requirements:

- A three-year bachelor's degree or the recognized equivalent from an accredited institution in the humanities or social sciences, with a minimum of 15% global studies–relevant courses
- Excellent English skills: Proficiency in English needs to be proven with an official English certificate. Native English speakers must provide proof of knowledge of a language other than English at the A2 level
- Knowledge of another foreign language at the A2 level (to be proven by a high school certificate and/or an internationally recognized test, score certificates, or equivalent proof of participation in language courses)
- The recognition of the respective documents and degrees is based on the requirements set by the German Central Office for Foreign Education.

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# Selection criteria

## Following criteria:

- 50%: Academic excellence and quality/recognition of home institution that has awarded the first degree
- 15%: Motivation and academic potential
- 20%: Compatibility of previous degree(s) with the EMGS programme
- 15%: Work experience/professional qualifications

The decision on admission is made by the EMGS Study Purposes and Selection Committee



# Application

## Documents to be included in the application:

1. A curriculum vitae in English (cf Europass)
2. Motivation letter in English
3. Proof of nationality (e.g. copy of passport)
4. Proof of residence (only for applicants who wish to apply for the Erasmus Mundus scholarship)
5. High school diploma or equivalent
6. Official high school transcripts
7. University diplomas
8. Official transcripts from your university
9. English language certificate test results (TOEFL, IELTS, CPE/CAE)
10. Proof of knowledge of another foreign language
11. One recommendation letter by an academic teacher
12. If applicable, proof of extracurricular activities and work experience

- 15 March 2024 (application for admission & Erasmus Mundus grant)
  - 31 May 2024 (application admission for “self-paying” students)
- 
- Announcement: between early June to end of July
  - The application for EMGS is at Leipzig University
  - If applicable, proof of extracurricular activities and work experience

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# Fees and support

## Participation costs:

- €2000 per year (all nationality)
- Do not cover travel costs to/from Winter and Summer schools
- Full participation costs will be incurred for each extra semester

## Support:

- Students with special needs can apply for financial support
- Regular Erasmus + scholarship for mobility between European partner universities (from year 1 to 2)
