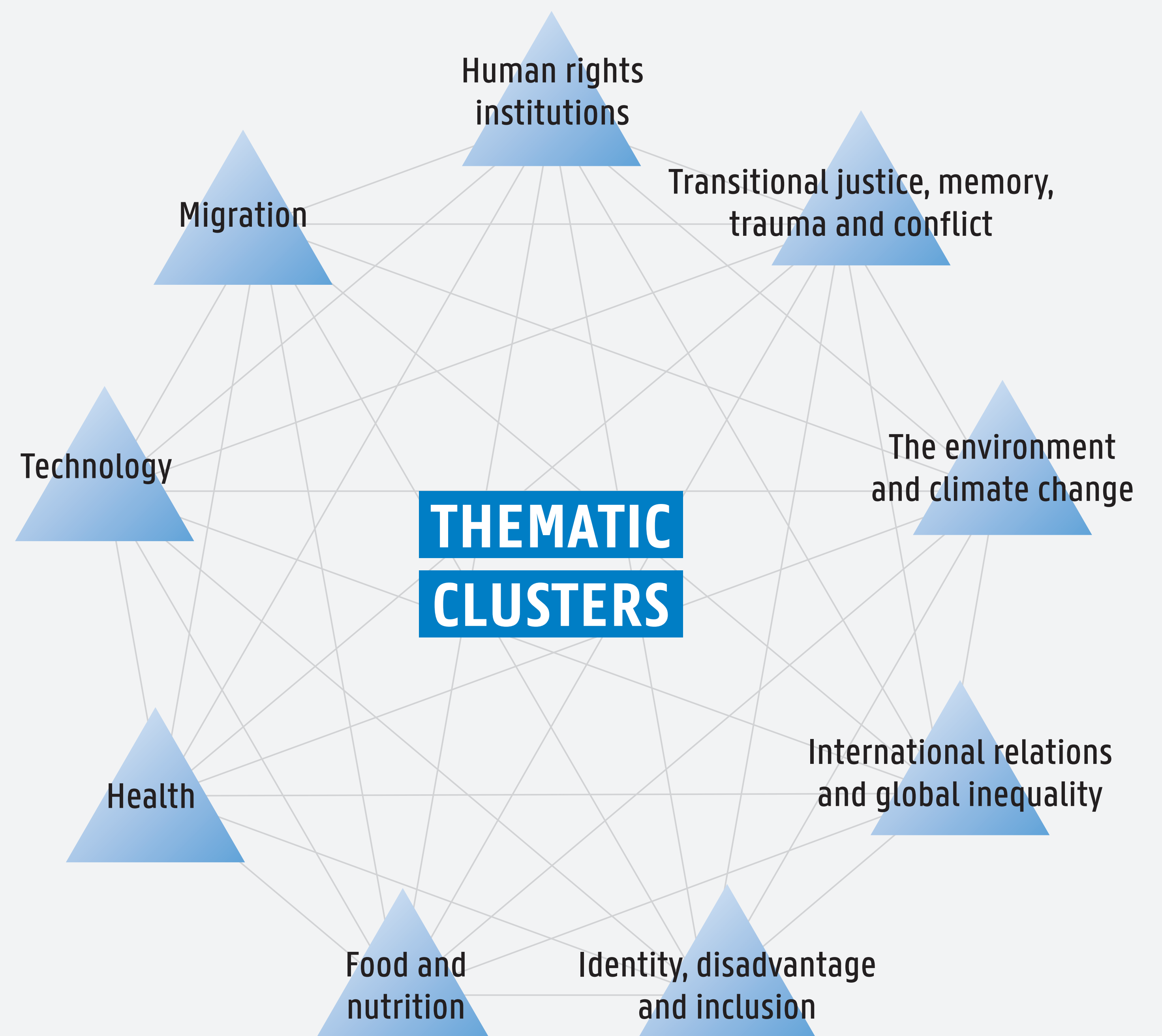

Five Impact strategies: each strategy constitutes a 'space' in which the researchers of the HRRN encounter and collaborate with different types of stakeholders, as follows:

- Human Rights Lab: researchers, students and societal stakeholders collaborate in the human rights lab to test and develop innovative ideas and solutions for human rights issues.
- Human Rights Forum: researchers, policy makers and societal organizations join forces to generate and apply new and existing knowledge that fosters the protection and fulfilment of human rights.
- Studio Human Rights: researchers and societal stakeholders meet the general public and strengthen the support base for human rights.
- Ghent City ♥ Human Rights: researchers collaborate with Ghent city in order to realize human rights locally.
- Ghent University ♥ Human Rights: researchers promote the realization of human rights at Ghent University and engage the students and the staff.
